When Victor Serebriakoff was fifteen, his teacher told him he would never finish school and should just learn a trade instead. Victor took the advice, dropped out, and spent the next seventeen years working a variety of odd jobs. But at 32 years old, Victor experienced an amazing transformation. An evaluation revealed that he was actually a genius with an IQ of 161! Since that time, Victor has gone on to write books, secure a number of patents, and become a successful businessman.
